

# Cottesloe Principal Shared Path Construction

## WORK STARTS EARLY JANUARY 2019

Work to extend the Principal Shared Path (PSP) along the Fremantle railway line from Grant Street Station to Victoria Street Station in Cottesloe commenced on Monday, 7 January 2019.

The path works have been prioritised to improve safety and accessibility between Cottesloe and Perth City by providing a continuous off-road facility. The new path will reduce possible conflicts with road traffic and provide a high-quality link to key tourist attractions along the route.

Working closely with the Town of Cottesloe and Department of Transport, we have created a design that complements the surrounding environment between the railway line and Curtin Avenue, and preserves as much of the existing vegetation as possible.

This is the first of a two-stage extension project, and will ensure everyone is able to travel safely on a dedicated off-road connection.

Keslake Group Pty Ltd, a local construction company, will be undertaking the works following the award of a contract in November 2018.

The works will:

- Extend the existing PSP by 2.8 kilometres to separate pedestrians and cyclists from motorists, and provide access to train stations, the Mosman Park Activity Centre and Cottesloe Primary School.

- Provide a pedestrian and cyclist crossing at Eric Street to avoid cyclists crossing at signalised intersections.
- Install new lighting, signs and pavement markings.

### Work program

During January, the existing railway reserve fence will be relocated, vegetation will be removed and Keslake Group will set up their office.

Before any vegetation is removed, environmental officers from Main Roads and the Town of Cottesloe will tag to identify and protect remaining vegetation.

In late January / early February, earthworks for the path construction will begin with the final path expected to be completed by the end of June 2019.

### Work hours

The construction works will be undertaken with appropriate traffic management and rail safety management plans in place, and the necessary approvals from the relevant authorities.

Work hours will be Monday to Saturday between 7am and 5pm. All activities will be contained within the road reserve, however, adjacent residents may hear construction activities including construction machinery moving around and machinery warning beeps. We will be working to minimise disruptions to the adjacent community as much as possible.
