

Wanneroo Road and Joondalup Drive Interchange

Construction Update

Interchange works progressing to schedule

Works on the Wanneroo Road and Joondalup Drive Interchange project are progressing according to schedule with the first stage of construction on track for completion by the end of April.

Stage 1 works

Since works recommenced in 2019, crews have focussed their efforts on the Wanneroo Road and Joondalup Drive intersection. Work crews have been clearing kerbs, pavement and vegetation within the site barriers. The clearing has proven challenging due to the location of the many underground services and low overhead powerlines, which has required the use of smaller, and more labour-intensive equipment to complete the works.

By the end of Stage 1, drainage in the area will also be upgraded and relocated. Redundant pipes will be removed and new pipes and pits will be installed under the ground.

Once the old pavement has been removed and new pipes are installed, works will begin on constructing the new roads. These works include laying permanent and temporary pavement ready for second stage of construction, which will begin in early May.

The barriers will remain in place until Stage 1 works are complete. They will then be relocated for the duration of Stage 2. More information will be shared with the community closer to the relocation date.



Night works

Some of the works to be undertaken during Stage 1 will require crews to work on the road, which will require lane closures. These activities will be undertaken during night shift to ensure disruption to road users is minimised and works are completed in the shortest possible timeframe, while also maintaining the safety of work crews and road users.

Night works will be undertaken on an intermittent basis between 7pm to 7am, Monday night to Sunday mornings, from 27 February until end April 2019.

Works may be undertaken at different areas of the site area, from Burns Beach Road roundabout to Cheriton Drive, and from Wanneroo Road and Joondalup Drive intersection to Clarkson Avenue.

Works will include:

- removing existing paving and the construction of new pavement
- installation of new services including drainage and electrical
- removal and installation of signage.

The level of noise will be kept to a minimum and should not impact upon any neighbouring residents.

How long will the works take?

- Stage 1 works at the Wanneroo Road and Joondalup Road intersection should be finished by end April 2019
- Night works will undertaken intermittently Monday to Saturday between 27 February and end April 2019
- Stage 2 works are scheduled to start by early May 2019 and finished January 2020
- The Wanneroo Joondalup Interchange Project is due for completion in early 2020.

Western Power works update

Western Power works commenced in January 2019 to relocate the overhead transmission line that runs along Wanneroo Road, across the Wanneroo Road and Joondalup Drive intersection.

Cape Utilities, Western Power's contractor is currently drilling underneath the intersection and laying foundations for four new steel poles to be installed in March 2019. (See map below for further information) Due to the proximity of the line to the intersection, much of the drilling work is being completed overnight to minimise traffic disruption.

In March 2019, Western Power crews will install four new poles. Cape Utilities is also expected to complete drilling works at approximately the same time.



Once Cape Utilities has completed drilling, and new poles are installed, Western Power will remove two steel poles no longer required and the redundant overhead wires that cross the intersection. It is expected these works will be completed in April 2019.
