

Wanneroo Road and Joondalup Drive Interchange

Project Update

Underground service location nearing completion

In recent weeks, we have undertaken extensive potholing in various parts of the alignment to ensure the project team is aware of any underground services before construction begins. To date, more than 2100 potholes have been completed, and can be identified by the small white posts in the ground.


For the next two of weeks, the last section of the potholing will be undertaken in the Wanneroo Road Joondalup Drive intersection during night works. These works will be completed before traffic barriers are installed.



Major works to commence in November

Barrier installation is set to begin at the intersection of Wanneroo Road and Joondalup Drive, and on the northern side of Burns Beach Road roundabout. The barriers will allow construction works to start on the new intersection and surrounding road improvements.

While works are underway, pedestrian and cycle paths will be temporarily relocated as indicated in the map below.

Changes for road users and local residents

- Wanneroo Road and Joondalup Drive will remain open during the works, but there will be speed restrictions in place.
- Three bus stops will be temporarily closed – please use adjacent stops.
- Night works will be undertaken to install the barriers, which will involve lane closures to ensure the safety of the community and work crews.
- Night works will last approximately two weeks and this first stage of construction will be complete early in the New Year.

Power line relocation

Western Power will be relocating a section of its overhead power lines underground to allow for the new bridge to be built over the Wanneroo Road and Joondalup Drive intersection. The works will be undertaken on the south-west corner of the Wanneroo/Joondalup intersection and run underground to the north-west corner.

Works will include open trench excavation on both corners, which will necessitate pedestrian and cyclist path diversions in the area.



Two large power poles will be removed and four smaller new poles will be installed.

Works are due to start early December with completion scheduled at end of April. No power outages are expected during this period.

More information about the works will be communicated closer to the starting date in early December.
